

Comparisons between The JMK Thin Client WS02 And Most Personal Computers

Definitions:

Personal Computer (PC) Standard Office multimedia PC running a standard (retail) version of the Windows operating system

JMK Thin Client (TC) Special Usage system with no disk drives, permanently installed software and a special version of Windows called Windows Embedded Standard.

Typical TC power consumption is 6 to 20 watts per hour
2. Most PC's can be modified by adding cards for additional ports and/or functionality, for instance adding a video card for digital video displays.
The JMK thin client cannot be modified. The JMK thin client does not have a parallel port and does not have a digital video port, contact JMK for details.

3 The JMK thin client is limited in the web browsers it can run due to the operating system software, the JMK thin client comes with Internet Explorer version 7.

4 The JMK thin clients can run hosted applications only, where a server is running the software and the JMK thin client displays the screens.

** Office applications are software programs for business use, they are available as installable stand-alone applications/packages, or as a service (run on either a host or server computer), a PC is capable of running either type.

5. Adding software permanently to a thin client requires special techniques.

Definitions:

- TC1** Administrator Mode Logging into the unit as the administrative user, having full privileges to add software or make changes
- TC2** User Mode with write filter **disabled** Using the default, automatic login having no privileges to make changes and limited ability add software and/or save files.
- TC3** User Mode with write filter **enabled** Using the default, automatic login having no privileges to make changes. Any added software and/or save files will be to volatile memory and will disappear when the unit is reset.
